Following our performance, we had to wait until the other 31 Bands had played, before we knew our result. This seemed like a very long wait for all. We achieved tenth place, which although not as high as last

year when we were seventh, gave us sufficient points to improve our placing in the league table. We now stand at second place in the fourth

section, which is a very pleasing achievement after only two years.

The main comments from the adjudicator were "pleasing euphonium/ baritones and good percussion rhythm" for the first movement. "A spirited effort and nice

rhythmic drive" for the second movement. The third movement comments were "pleasing dynamic control" and for the final movement that the Band "plays with verve and enjoyment."

Well done to all members of the Contest Band.


